



Important Parking & Transportation Announcements/Updates

Temporary Office Location: 1204 N. Patterson St. (*next to Bursary/inside the One Card office*).
Operating Hours: Monday–Thursday 8:30AM–5:00PM/Friday 8:30AM–2:30PM.

Construction on the parking decks will begin on Dec. 10, 2007 and last until Fall Semester 2008. Half of the Oak Street Lot and all of the Sustella Avenue Lot (behind the recreation center) will be closed during this time period.

During this transition period, **resident student parking** will be available in student spaces in the following lots **overnight**:

- University Center, Martin Hall, Oak Street Lot (back portion), Centennial Hall Lot, P.E. Complex Lot, Boone Lot, College Lot, Georgia Avenue Lot, Blazer Lot.

Off campus commuter students will need to park in the following lots and bus to main campus:

- North Campus, Ashley Cinemas, Billy Grant Field, Valdosta Mall (Sears far side next to Baytree Rd.), Continuing Education, University Park.
**Parking at the Valdosta Mall and Ashley Cinemas is only permitted until 4:00pm, Mon.–Fri.*
- Field House Project – on Mary Street (available the end of January 2008)

ALL STUDENTS (on campus & off campus) may park in any available student lot; however, on campus residents can only park overnight in lots that are specified.

Employee parking for spring semester has been added in the following lots:

- Admissions, grass area by Alumni House, Valdosta Board of Education (behind the University Center), 114 Ga. Avenue. Employee spaces in the Oak Street Lot have been relocated to the back of that lot.

Comments and Helpful Parking Hints

Parking updates will be provided via the Web site www.vsuparking.com. Please check this site weekly. All new parking areas will have the appropriate signage. On campus students need to be prepared to walk from Centennial to main campus and from main campus to the University Center. Students need to be proactive in planning for parking spring semester 2008. Plan to arrive an hour earlier to your destination. Walking, riding a bike and car pooling are good examples of how to have a successful parking experience during this period of growth.

Shuttle buses will run to these off site lots during the day to provide transportation to main campus. This will be the primary focus of the Shuttle Buses. The Shuttle routes will alter after the start of Spring semester to accommodate the transition as needed.
